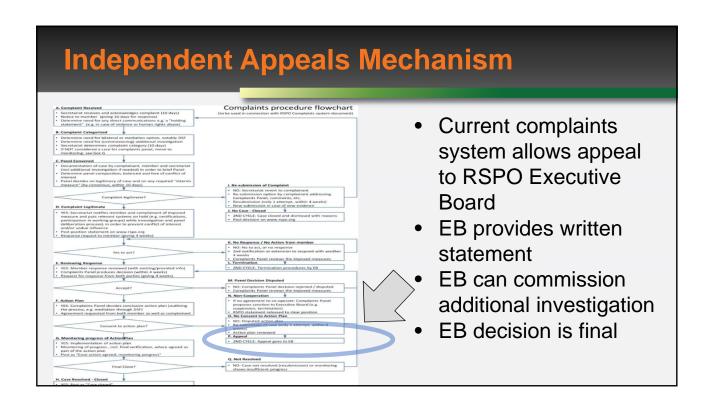

### **Complaints background**

RSPO website shows around 50 complaints

- 80% against growers
  - mostly land-use related: HCV, FPIC, NPP
- Two thirds Indonesia
  - Kalimantan 50%, Sumatra 15%

- Malaysia & Africa: around 10% each
- Few non-land use complaints
  - Some CB complaints in past
  - Retailers

### **Appeals**

- Three received to date

# **Independent Appeals Mechanism**

### **Background**

RSPO General Assembly Resolution 6f (2013)

- Directs RSPO Executive Board to ensure that there is strict separation of executive powers in handling complaints & grievances
- Refers to lack of independent appeal mechanism

### Process of developing independent appeals mechanism

With ASI's support:

- 1. Comparative review of other schemes, identification of best practice elements and drafting of proposed appeal procedures
- 2. Expert group meeting held in Jakarta, 8 July 2015
- 3. Public consultation meeting in Kuala Lumpur, 8 Sept 2015
- 4. Draft documents posted on RSPO website

# **Independent Appeals Mechanism**

- Draft appeals documents comprise:
  - 1. Appeals procedure
  - 2. Terms of reference for the appeals panel
  - 3. Appeals submission form
- Comment deadline 30 November 2015

Main changes from existing system:

- Longer, more structured, procedural elements
- Independent panel (1 to 3 panel members)
- Transparency: external reporting
- Increased costs: both internal & external costs.

### Parties involved

- Appellant
- Respondent
- RSPO Secretariat
- Appeals Panel members

# **Independent Appeals Mechanism**

### **Process**

- 1. Appellant submits to RSPO Secretariat using appeals submission form
- 2. Preliminary review
- 3. Respondent invited to participate
- 4. Panel members identified
- 5. Panel members confirm terms of reference, independence

(continued)

### **Process** (continued)

- 6. Secretariat submits information to panel
- 7. Panel reviews evidence, prepares report
- 8. Draft report circulated to parties
- 9. Final resolution
- 10. Secretariat keeps records, publishes summary, identifies improvements

Target timeline: 90 days after receipt of appeals

# **Independent Appeals Mechanism**

### **KEY ISSUES**

- Grounds for appeal
- Independence framework
- Management of costs and distribution of costs between the parties

### **KEY ISSUE 1: Grounds for appeal?**

- i) "Procedural impropriety" in the complaints handling process
- ii) Reasoning of Complaints Panel not disclosed
- iii) Substantial and manifest error in reasoning
- iv) Complaints panel member/s had a conflict of interest
- v) Substantial evidence was not taken into consideration

# **Independent Appeals Mechanism**

# KEY ISSUE 2: Independence framework for Appeals Panel

- Set out in Terms of Reference document
- Self-declaration by Panel members:
  - (i) No current or prior involvement with the complaint
  - (ii) No current involvement in RSPO complaints system
  - (iii) Not been a member of the complaints panel in the last 2 years
  - (iv) No commercial or other relationship with parties to the appeal

# KEY ISSUE 2: Independence framework for Appeals Panel (continued)

- Appellant and respondent have opportunity to object to proposed panel members
- Secretariat considers whether objections are valid

# **Independent Appeals Mechanism**

### **KEY ISSUE 3: Costs**

- RSPO's costs will include:
  - Panel members fees/honorarium/expenses
  - Fees of experts requested by panel members
  - Other costs: translators fees, accommodation/travel costs, appellant/respondent expenses
- Possibility of standing panel if appeals are frequent (continued)

### **KEY ISSUE 3: Costs (continued)**

- To recover some of its costs, RSPO may charge appeal fees to appellants:
  - Administration fee
  - If the appellant loses: costs of the appeal process
- Panel will give specific recommendation on costs
- RSPO to publish schedule of appeal fees
- Financial support for certain categories of appellant
